Diablo de Uco is the result of a careful combination of Australian enology, North American viticulture and Argentine experience. The wine was made with a careful selection of grapes from our single vineyard situated 1,100 meters high in the Uco Valley Region of Mendoza, Argentina at the foot of the Andes Mountains. Our wines reflect the true harmony between cutting edge winemaking and the natural and pure elements of our estate vineyard.

Harvest: 2004

Vineyard: Single vineyard in The Uco Valley - Tupungato, Mendoza at 1,100 meters above sea level, planted in 1997.

Winemaker: David Kingsbury - Australian born, trained in France, long-time resident of Mendoza, Argentina.

The grapes were harvested by hand at optimum maturity and processed in a new state of the art winery. Careful attention is paid to maximizing the best of the grape characteristics during the wine-making process and with a touch of oak.

Characteristics: The nose reveals the unique bouquet of the Malbec grape with jam scents made famous by this Argentine wine. It is rich in the mouth with soft tannins and a smooth finish. The oak is soft and complements the fruity flavors.

Analysis: Alcohol: 13,80%
Acidity: 5,90 grams/liter [tartaric acid]
PH: 3,40
Volatile Acidity: .40 grams per liter [tartaric acid]
Sugar: 2,32 grams per liter
